





You have to carry several kilos of equipment and materials into the classroom (Books, CD Player, DVD player, discs, etc)

It sometimes takes ages to find the correct track on the cassette / CD / video

It would be useful to have a copy of what you write on the board for next lesson, but it takes a long time to copy it down



What is Blended Learning?


"Blended Learning refers to a language course which combines an F2F (face-to-face) classroom component with an appropriate use of technology."
